Message from our 43rd WRJ President



Since the last *Voice of Sisterhood*, we have been very busy. In May, the WRJ Board voted to make a contribution to *The Torah: A Woman's Commentary* sponsored by WRJ National. This Woman's Commentary came about because "the five daughters of Zelophehad in the Book of Numbers approach Moses and the leaders of the people. They see a problem that needs a solution: they have not been given an inheritance that they believe is due to them. They refuse to be left out and demand their rightful share. And so they dare speak to Moses, the priest Eleazar, all the other leaders. They say: 'Give us a holding among our father's kin. Give us a share of our heritage, why should we be left out?' They get what they want – a share, a large share. Also, as a result of their courage, a new Torah law is created, one that intends to benefit future generations long after them."

Their story is the story of WRJ's *The Torah: A Women's Commentary*. The Women of Reform Judaism said: "Give us a share among our brothers. We are no longer willing to be left out." Instead of land, WRJ asks for something even more enduring - 'Give us a share of our Torah.' The result is a Torah commentary written by women. With this commentary we will continue as sisters to empower the women - and men - who come after us for generations to come. Because of our contribution a Parashat (or weekly reading) has been named in our honor. We chose and received our first choice: Vay'chi – Genesis 47:28-50:26, Jacob's blessings for his children. (We will celebrate this special Shabbat on December 22.) We felt this was close to our hearts as our WRJ-Sisterhood, in celebrating 100 years, has blessed many, many generations of children and hopes to bless many more.

WRJ successfully celebrated 100 years of Sisterhood thanks to Executive Vice-President, Jo Anne Fusco and her co-chairs Alison Blen and Julie Boshwit. There was another great Adopt-a-School program led by Vice President Sue Pfeffer, and her chairs Debbie Jackson and Phyllis Niegelberg. We sponsored an annual birthday party at the Memphis Jewish Home thanks to Vice President Debbie Kriger, and chairs Sally Kesselman and Brenda Gold. Vice President Julie Boshwit and her ever ready chairs of Special Onegs, Toba Kornberg and Jeanne Alpert, will make sure that Jake Greenstein's Bar Mitzvah luncheon will be followed by enough homemade sweets for the entire congregation. We extend a special welcome to Nancy Sissman who is now the chair of the Y.E.S. fund contributions.

I hope that all of you and your families have a Happy and Healthy New Year and that I will see you at the WRJ paid-up membership opening meeting on Sunday, October 28th.
